Bob Olliff — The United Way Campaign

Rotarian Ray McKinney introduced Rotarian Bob Olliff who spoke on the work of the United way.

Bob informed the club that the United Way campaign raised about \$407,000 last year and used it to support 20 local agencies. "Many of these agencies provide service to our community 24 hours a day, 7 days a week," he said.

Bob noted that the prosperity and growth of our part of the state also brings an increase in social problems. Overall the United Way

charities serve approximately 35,000 clients from infants to the elderly.

Of particular note are a number of high profile organizations including: The Boys and Girls Club, Meals for Seniors, The Family Literacy Program (through our local libraries), and the Rotary Care-Ring Program that provides telephone contact for seniors.

Bob concluded his talk by showing a very

moving video in which beneficiaries of the United Way services described the difference that our social agencies have made in their lives.

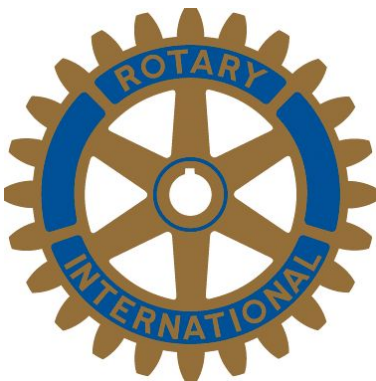
